# Landlord Information

## Landlords!! We have some incentives for you!

## New Landlord Incentives:

- RHA will offer a one-time payment of up to \$1,000 or equal to one month's rent whichever is lesser to landlords who are new to the Housing Choice Voucher.
- New Landlords includes an additional \$250 per additional unit, up to five units.

## **Existing Landlord Incentives:**

- RHA will offer a \$500 payment to existing landlords who lease a unit to a HCV participant. The incentive doesn't apply to those who transfer new units owned by the same landlord.
- Legacy Landlords include an additional \$500 per unit for up to five units per year.

## Limited Damage Claims:

RHA will offer a one-time payment, not to exceed one month's contract rent or \$1,000 to the landlord where an HCV participants tenancy ends and there is a tenant caused damage to the unit that exceeds the security deposit collected by the owner.

## The RHA HCV Landlord Program

The Rockford Housing Authorities' Housing Choice Voucher Program provides rental assistance for very low and low-income households. Rental assistance is provided on behalf of the family or individual participants to private landlords. Program participants are responsible for choosing the type of housing they feel best suits their household. They can select a single-family home, townhouse, or an apartment.

Once the participant has chosen their housing unit and the landlord is willing to accept the housing voucher towards the payment of rent, the housing



authority will inspect it to assure that it meets the federal minimum housing quality standards and any local building codes. All rental units must meet minimum standards of health and safety.

A housing subsidy is paid to the landlord directly by RHA on behalf of the participating family. The family then pays the difference between the actual rent charged by the landlord and the amount by the program.

# National **Nonprofit Day**

According to the National Center for Charitable Statistics, there are 1.8 million registered organizations in the United States. # Women's Equality Day

The date was selected to commemorate the 1920 certification of the 19th Amendment to the Constitution, granting women the right to vote and this year, 2023, marks the 103nd anniversary of the 19th Amendment.

# WOMEN'S EQUALITY

DAY 2023 Accelerating Equality & Empowerment

In the early 19th century, American women, who generally couldn't inherit property and made half of a man's wages in any available jobs, began organizing to demand political rights and representation. In the U.S., the 19th Amendment to the Constitution was first introduced in 1878, but it failed to gain traction. To win the right to vote, women circulated countless petitions, gave speeches, published newspapers, and travelled the country to win support. They were frequently ridiculed, harassed and sometimes attacked by mobs and police; some were thrown in jail, and then treated brutally when they protested. Still they persevered.

It wasn't until women living during World War I, made their contributions painfully obvious that women's suffrage finally gained enough support. Women aren't done fighting for equal rights. Today, the wage gap between men and women still impacts women's economic power, and gender-based discrimination is still common in the workplace.

Women's Equality Day is all about uplifting and empowering women, and marveling at how far women have progressed, defying all odds and oppression. RHA knows the value of having women on our team Laura Snyder, RHA CEO is the first woman to hold this title since the inception of the housing authority. RHA is also proud to have leadership with Odessa Walker, COO, Jana Janes, Finance Director, eight woman managers and also, our Board Members; Jessica Wilson, Vice Chairman, Anisha Grimmett, Commissioner, and NeAngela Dixon, Commissioner.

# **Celebrate Labor Day!**

Labor Day is celebrated on September 5th this year and pays tribute to the contributions and achievements of the American worker. The labor movement created Labor Day in the late 19th century and became a federal holiday in 1894. It has been celebrated on the first Monday in September since. It symbolizes the end of summer for many Americans and is celebrated with parties and a day off of work.

Labor Day is an annual celebration of workers and their

achievements. In the late 1800s, at the top of the Industrial Revolution in the US, the average person living in America worked a 12-hour day for seven days. Children as young as 5 or 6 also worked in mills, factories, and mines across the county, earning a fraction of their adult wages. Labor unions grew more popular and vocal in the 18th century and began organizing

strikes and rallies to protest poor working conditions and wages.

The idea of the "Workingmen's holiday" celebrated on the first Monday in September caught on in other industrial centers across the country, and many states passed legislation recognizing it. However, Congress legalized the holiday 12 years later when strikes and boycotts became more prominent than ever.

The first Labor Day celebration was held on Tuesday, September 5th, 1882, in New York City. Labor Day celebrations have a theme of parades, picnics, barbecues, fireworks, and/or a nice relaxing day off work. "The nation pays tribute on Labor Day to the creator of so much of the nation's strength, freedom, and leadership – the American worker." – U.S Department of Labor.

Students need a health exam/physical within one year of starting kindergarten, sixth grade and ninth grade -- or when entering an Illinois school system for the first time. All other high school students need a sport physical if they plan to participate in sports. Sports physicals are good for 13 months and do not replace the required ninth grade physical. Completed physical paperwork can be included in registration packets.

## About Rockford, 815 Day, and Ways to Participate in the Fun




